Dear friends,



Kindertransport

Thanks to the initiative of Renata Harris, the *Projekt Jüdisches Leben in Frankfurt* has been campaigning for a memorial to commemorate the Kindertransport for several years. Now it is almost time. The monument on the corner of Kaiserstraße and Gallusanlage is due to be inaugurated at the end of May 2021, we hope.

At the same time, the opening of an exhibition on the rescue of children in the German National Library is planned. Whether it will be possible to invite contemporary witnesses to this, which we very much hope, depends on the further course of the pandemic.
